FAQ

What is the goal of the U-15 RockFest events?

The goal of the U-15 RockFest events is to provide a nationwide opportunity for youth curlers to develop their skills and compete against curlers from neighbouring provinces and territories.

The new events focus on developing the skills of youth curlers as **individuals**, helping them develop a well-rounded skillset in all aspects of the game in a fun and competitive environment.

With this age and stage (Train to Train) being critical in our Long-Term Curler Development framework, U-15 RockFest events provide new opportunities for youth curlers to compete and have fun while playing, while extending their learning on and off the ice.

Which U-15 RockFest do I try and qualify for?

Youth curlers across Canada will have the chance to compete at one of the following events:

- U-15 RockFest West (British Columbia, Yukon, Northwest Territories and Alberta)
- U-15 RockFest Prairies (Saskatchewan, Manitoba)
- U-15 RockFest East (Northern Ontario, Ontario, Nunavut, Quebec)
- U-15 RockFest Atlantic (New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland & Labrador)

What is the 2024 U-15 RockFest regional events dates, locations, quota number of competitors, and qualification deadlines?

U-15 RockFest Prairies

U-15 RockFest East

What will each event feature?

An action-packed schedule of singles competitions, triples curling, skill development clinics, fun off-ice activities and the Golden RockFest.

Updated: November 15, 2023



What is the age eligibility in order to qualify?

The events are for individual U-15 curlers aged 14 or younger as of June 30, 2023.

Why do curlers qualify as individuals and not teams?

At this age and stage, numerous youth curlers are not on teams yet. These events will allow the opportunity for individual curlers who are not yet on teams and who are on teams to make connections with other kids from their province or territory.

How does my youth curler qualify?

All curlers must download Curling Canada's Singles App, "Singles Curling", for iOS and Android, and complete a variety of shots such as a hit and stay, draw, hit and roll, guard, peel and more. The shots are scored and inputted into the app, with the top curlers from each Member Association receiving an invitation to their respective regional event.

In order to qualify for a U-15 Regional RockFest event, curlers will have to score a minimum of 10 out of 36 points.

Curlers can begin to submit their scores for qualification on the Singles Curling app on December 15, 2023. (MAs: BC, SK, MB, NT, NU, NO, ON, QC, NL, NS, NB)

MAs: AB, PE, NS, YT will host in-person qualifying events.

Is there a minimum age to qualify for the U-15 RockFest events?

No. However, curlers must be able to throw full length with the full sized rocks, and score a minimum of 10 out of 36 points.

Is the App free?

Yes, Curling Canada's Singles App, "Singles Curling", is free for everybody in Canada.

How do you get signed into the App? How do I make an account?

Once you download the "Singles Curling" App, proceed by opening the app.



At the bottom, you will notice 2 buttons. Press “Create Account”.

From here you will be able to proceed with creating an account and will be able to login.

Where or when do we enrol in the Competition so that it appears in the app?

Curlers **do not** need to enrol in a Competition. On **December 15, 2023** curlers can start submitting their scores for qualification to the Leaderboard.

In the App, when you click “Score a Competition”, select “Leaderboard” on the top right button.

How are scores verified?

If a Member Association is running the Singles Competition and entering scores on the leaderboard, they will verify the accuracy of the scores.

If a coach or youth program leader is entering scores, we rely on the coach acting with integrity and following the Coaching Code of Ethics and entering accurate scores.

Are parents/guardians able to “Score a Competition”?

No. Parents/guardians are not able to “Score a Competition” for their curler.

Parents/guardians must find someone else to help score their child.

This is applicable even if the parent/guardian is the youth program instructor.

Why do 2 curlers have to be scored in order to “Score a Competition”?

All curlers are able to have 2 sweepers in their same age category to sweep their shots, so we encourage at least 2 curlers to participate in Singles Competitions to maintain the advantage of having sweepers.

Curlers cannot use sweepers who are not also participating in the Singles Competition.

If there are only 2 curlers being scored. The non-throwing curler must be either a sweeper or line caller. The throwing curler is permitted to sweep their own rock.

When I look at the leaderboard there are some people already on there, are we able to start with the competition?

No. For U-15 RockFest qualification. Curlers can begin to submit their scores for U-15 RockFest qualification on the Singles Curling app on December 15, 2023.



The Competitions you see on the leaderboards now are from test events or Member Association hosted competitions.

Some Member Association have different Competitions set up for different reasons. Examples: Development Camps, Provincial High Performance Groups, etc.

Do you only get one try at the competition, but we can run a practice as much as possible?

No. After December 15th, we encourage U-15 curlers to submit more than one Competition score. We also encourage curlers and their coaches to use the practice side of the app before submitting Competition scores.

For Tiebreakers, the next best competition score will be accepted. We encourage all U-15 curlers to submit at least 2 Competition scores in the case their 2nd score needs to be used in order the break ties for qualification.

Do you have to report the complete competition all at one session, or can it be broken up between different sessions?

Yes. Competitions can be scored across 1 or 2 sessions.

We encourage 1 session because the ice will be same for the curlers for the entire Competition and this will mean greater accuracy of a curlers score to complete the Competition all at once.

Competitions should be able to be completed in approximately 75 minutes (4 curlers).

Is there a cost to enter if my curler qualifies?

The registration fee for each Regional event will be set at \$50 per curler.

Curlers are responsible to pay for their own expenses to attend the U-15 Regional RockFest event.

When will invites be sent out?

Within 72 hours after the qualification deadline, invites will be sent out via email. Curlers will have 5 days to accept their invite.



My Province/Territory is **not holding an in-person qualifying event. What happens if there is a tie between 2 of more curlers in the leaderboard standings in order qualify for the U-15 RockFest?**

The next best competition score will be accepted. We encourage all U-15 curlers to submit at least 2 Competition scores in the case their 2nd score needs to be used in order the break ties for qualification. They can submit more than two Competition scores.

My Province/Territory is holding an in-person qualifying event. What happens if there's a tie between 2 or more curlers in order to qualify?

If there is a tie between 2 or more curlers, all curlers will be scored by throwing 2 shots (1 Draw and 1 Hit and Stay).

If they are still tied, curlers will throw a draw to the button and it will be measured. If the measurement is tied, then they throw a draw shot again with the other turn and measure it. Draw shots are thrown until the tie is broken.

No sweepers or line callers will be involved in the tie-breaking shots. Curlers will be permitted to sweep their own rocks.

Can my curler submit more than one competition score?

Yes, your curler can submit multiple competition scores. We encourage your curler to submit more than one competition in the case there are tie-breakers.

Is there sweeping and line calling for this event? If so, who is doing the line calling/sweeping?

Yes, there is sweeping and line calling at both the in-person qualifying events and the Regional events. At both the qualifying & regional events, other curlers (participants) will be the sweepers and line callers.

Within reason, if it's a flat out sweeper or line calling error (or burned rock), the curler will be allowed to rethrow. For this reason, parents/team coaches are not able to be the scorers.



If you're using the app for practice and your team plays U18, but you have a U15 on the team, they have to practice different shots than the rest of their team?

For both U15 and U18 Competition shots, the first 6 shots are the same. In U18 there are 2 additional shots. The scores are age and stage appropriate, with the U15 scoring zones having a broader range than U18.

Do the curlers enter their own scores?

No, curlers do not enter their own scores.

We're asking coaches to be the ones that enter the scores. This can be an instructor in your youth program or a coach in your curling centre.

A minimum of 2 curlers must be scored at one time.

How many times can I practice uses the app?

Curlers can practice as much as they want.

Can you "Run a Practice" with 1 curler?

Yes, youth program instructors and coaches can "Run a Practice" with 1-6 curlers.

If I download the app as a coach, will I be able to create Profiles for each player?

No. A parent or guardian must create a profile first and then their curler creates a profile, and the parent becomes their guardian. That creates an adult connection between the coach and the curler, and the parent must approve the connection.

A coach cannot create a profile for a curler and a parent/guardian has to be involved with the connection piece.

Can I disconnect my curler from a Coach?

Yes, if a curler or parent/guardian doesn't want them connected to a Coach anymore, they are able to disconnect.



Do individual curlers need to bring a Coach?

Individual curlers do not need to bring a coach.

If they do bring a coach, coaches can go on the ice, but we won't have their own coach or parent score their own curlers. The more coaches we can get involved, the better for everyone. Curling Canada's Safe Sport requirements will be required for coaches.

What are the participant helmet requirements?

All participants aged 12 and under (as of first date of the competition) must meet Curling Canada's Helmet Requirements:

Acceptable Head Protection:

- CSA approved helmets for use on ice, snow
- CSA approved helmets for skateboarding, equestrian
- Curling specific headgear - toques and ball caps - chinstrap must be used

Not acceptable:

- Headbands/halos
- Bike helmets

How does Curling Canada safeguard the playing environment?

All participants of Curling Canada events must complete Curling Canada's Safe Sport Education Program.

Curlers (with their parents if under the age of 18) will be required to read and acknowledge several documents including but not limited to:

- An Assumption of Risk, Waiver of Claims and Release of Liability (inclusive of a photo release)
- The Universal Code of Conduct to Prevent and Address Maltreatment in Sport
- Curling Canada's Code of Conduct
- Concussion Awareness Attestations.

Other Adults who are assisting and organizing the event will have to complete Safe Sport Education and Curling Canada's Screening program.



Registrants of Curling Canada's U-15 RockFest events will receive instructions on how to complete the Safe Sport Education Program after the registration closing dates.
